UKRAINE RESPONSE OVERSIGHT PROJECT ANNOUNCEMENT

Audit of the Bureau of International Security and Nonproliferation Assistance to Ukraine

The Ukraine related activities of the Department of State (Department) are a top oversight priority for the Office of Inspector General (OIG). The objective of this audit is to determine whether the Bureau of International Security and Nonproliferation (ISN) conducted planning and monitoring of its assistance programs and efforts in Ukraine in accordance with federal law and Department requirements.

Among the immediate concerns following Russia’s full-scale invasion of Ukraine on February 24, 2022, were the security and structural safety of nuclear and radiological facilities in the country, as well as the potential for Russia’s use of weapons of mass destruction on the civilian population including Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear, and High-Yield Explosive (CBRNE) weapons.

According to ISN—whose mission is to “protect U.S. national security by preventing, disrupting, and countering the proliferation of weapons of mass destruction (WMD), whether nuclear, radiological, biological, or chemical, their systems of delivery, and destabilizing conventional weapons”—the bureau has obligated more than \$82 million since February 2022 to support Ukraine and nearby regional partners affected by the conflict. Those efforts include providing security, advisory support, and critical equipment and training across the “CBRNE spectrum,” as well as implementing sanctions.
